### So what exactly is a Certificate IV in Competitive Manufacturing?

Great question! The *Certificate IV in Competitive Manufacturing* is aimed predominantly at team leaders working in a competitive manufacturing environment. Completion of the course may lead to greater opportunities in your specialised area depending on your workplace.

The *Certificate IV in Competitive Manufacturing* is a terrific course if you want to enhance upon your existing your fundamental manufacturing knowledge, and covers topics such as: productivity, team building, problem-solving, resource management and it will also look at how you can be more innovative in the workplace.

### Sounds great. What jobs can I get if I have a Certificate IV in Competitive Manufacturing?

- Manufacturing team leader
- Shop floor supervisor
- Production Supervisor
- Operations Supervisor

### What types of skills will I gain from a Certificate IV in Competitive Manufacturing?

• **Communication and team building:** Access and use workplace communication tools and equipment, debrief on workplace changes with the relevant stakeholders, and record production or other work related information.

• **Initiative and problem-solving:** Identify factors within team or work areas that are a constraint to work efficiency or reaching production outcomes. Analyse problems, implications or suggestions for improvements.

• **Planning and self-management skills:** Collect, organise and analyse information from work activities and implement 5S procedures. Monitor resource use and minimise waste in own work activity.

• **Learning:** setting and achieving goals, adapting new skills, seeking and implementing feedback, identifying and filling skills gaps.

• **Technology:** Assess operational efficiency of technology within own skill level and that of team members.

### Sounds exciting. How do I actually take the course?

The *Certificate IV in Competitive Manufacturing* is delivered in the following formats:

**1:** As a Traineeship, attracting funding from the government. Under an Existing Worker Traineeship, a staff member undertakes a vocational training qualification while they continue to work in an organisation, increasing productivity through the assessment of skills gaps and adequate training.

**2:** One on one coaching and mentoring which involves practical learning with the assessment of activity based

skills supported by portfolios, work based projects, direct assessment and observations.

**3:** Through pathways such as Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL), Recognition of Current Competencies (RCC), and assessment only for students with substantiated work histories and experience within their workplace.

## What other qualifications do I need before I enrol?

There are no prerequisites for this qualification at EIM Training, however before you enroll in a *Certificate IV in Competitive Manufacturing* you need to demonstrate work experience through job descriptions, or an

appropriate manufacturing qualification such as a *Certificate III in Competitive Manufacturing*. The course is aimed at existing workers under a traineeship.

## What pathway can I pursue once I've achieved a Certificate IV in Competitive Manufacturing?

## I want to do it. How can I pay for the course?

### Funded schemes available include:

Government Funded Traineeships: Employers who enrol their staff in Government Funded Traineeships may also be eligible for Federal and/or State Government Funding for each trainee, for each course. This can be up to \$4000 funding per trainee for the employer.
